Re: **Special Occasion Licensed (SOL) hobby brewer/vintner competitions.**

### **Introduction**

These changes support the implementation of the Liquor Policy Review (LPR) recommendation # 50.

*50. Permit hobby brewers and vintners to apply for an SOL to host competition events, allowing homemade beers and wines to be sampled by both judges and the public.*

### **New Policy**

Amendments to the definition of “private special occasion licence” and section 15 of the Liquor Control and Licensing Regulation now permit hobby brewers and vintners to obtain an SOL to hold a competition to showcase and judge beer, wine and cider that they have made.

Liquor entered into the competition can be made in a residence or in an establishment licensed under 12.1 of the Act (a “Ferment on Premises or UBrew/UVin licensee”).

There must be no charge for tasting or entry into the event by attendees (organizers may charge a fee to those who enter their products into the competition for event cost recovery).
